

The EU and Armenia are laying out their vision for a new, ambitious Partnership Agenda.

To underpin this partnership, the EU is proposing a €270 million Resilience and Growth Plan for Armenia for 2024-2027:

The Resilience and Growth Plan will focus on the following priorities:



A resilient Armenian society

- Keep supporting democratic reforms, human rights, and rule of law.
- Support reforms and investments in skills and employment.
- Support the long-term integration of displaced people including on housing and employment, alongside international partners.







Investing in connectivity and businesses

- Support Armenia's energy diversification and security with more investments in renewables and stronger transmission network with Georgia.
- Mobilise investments in transport infrastructure to develop Armenia's role as a logistics and transport hub in the region.
- Invest in business development targeted at tech, startups and SMEs looking to access new markets.
- Mobilise investments under the Economic and Investment Plan in connectivity and support Armenia's participation in regional projects, in particular the Black Sea electricity cable.



Bringing Armenia closer to Europe

- Help strengthen administrations and institutions and support regulatory alignment, with experts and technical assistance (TAIEX, Twinning).
- Support aviation and nuclear safety.
- Contribute to Armenia's diversification of exports and support the promotion of Armenian export products in new markets.
