COAF SMART Centers

Tentative Budget:

Supporting Education Reforms & Skills in the Eastern Partnership region (SER)

- Peer Learning: Regional exchange with other EaP countries and EU Member States on shared challenges on key themes of education reform and system development.

Focus in Armenia:

- •Armenia's RED is completed and its findings discussed at the high-level policy dialogues.
- •The project supports a functional review of education governance and capacity-building actions based on RED recommendations. Armenia also takes part in regional peer learning activities with other EaP countries.

Project purpose:

Coordination and policy support for EU action on youth in the EaP region continued with strengthened outreach, partnerships and measurable results.



The EUD initiated establishment of the Youth Advisory Council to provide a continuous structured mechanism for Armenian youth for contribution to shaping and implementation of youth-related EU programmes and initiatives from January 2025. It will act as a bridge between the EUD, the youth community of Armenia and relevant state entities, fostering wider engagement, peer-to-peer communication channel, and dialogue mechanism for young people.
